[S. of Rev Andrew D., DD], Chindwara, India. b. 15 February 1888. Entd. Lower I In service of Bank of Scotland, 1904- 1908; passed membership examination of the Institute of Bankers, Edinburgh, 1908; in service of Hong Kong and Shanghai Banking Corporation in London, 1908-10; in Hamburg, 1910-11; in New York, 1911-15; in Yokohama, Japan, from December 1919. 2nd Lieut., 1st Highland Brigade, R. F. A. (T. F.), 6 Oct. 1915. Served in France and Belgium, with the 51st Highland Div., 1916; and with the Lahore Div., Sept. 1916- 18. Acting Lieut., Nov. 1916; Lieut., Aug. 1917. Discharged 2 May 1919

DANSON, Arthur Llewelyn 1885- 1889

S. of Rev. J. M. D. 18 King Street. Age 10. Entd. Classical I B. A. Oxon, 1898; passed into Indian Civil Service 1898; served in the Punjab as assistant commissioner; under-secretary to Government, 1905-7; registrar Chief Court, Punjab, 1908; died at Lahore as result of an accident, 27 March 1912.

DANSON, Edmund Wilmot 1887- 1892

S of Rev. J. Myers D., 18 King Street. Age 9. Entd. Middle I Served an apprenticeship in Aberdeen White Star Line; attached to Royal Navy (Channel Squadron), 1897- 8; joined Royal Indian Marine, 1899; engaged mostly on survey of coast of Persian Gulf and South India; took part in Somali Expedition (medal); died at Moulmein, Burma, as result of a shooting accident, 23 May 1921. Naval Transport Officer, Bombay (lent from Royal Indian Marine). Commander, R. I. M. Jan. 1917

DANSON E(rnest) D(enny) Logie 1892- 1894

S. of Rev. [J. Myers] D, Ingleboro' House, Castlehill. Agd, 12 Entd. Classical I M. A., 1902; tutor in York, 1902- 4; student, Episcopal Theological College, Edinburgh, 1904- 6; ordained deacon, 1906; priest 1907; assistant curate, S. Paul's Cathedral, Dundee, 1906- 11; St Andrew's Cathedral, Singapore, 1911- 12; acting chaplain in Java, 1913; chaplain of Seremban, F. M. S., 1914; bishop of Labuan and Sarawak, 1917. D. D. Aberd., 1921 Chaplain and Hon. Captain, Malay States Volunteer Rifles, 1 Jan. 1916. Resigned commission on appointment as Bishop of Labuan and Sarawak.

DANSON, James Gordon 1894- 1903

S. of Rev J. Myers D., Ingleboro' House, Castlehill, b. 1 March 1865. Entd. Middle I. M. B., Ch. B., 1908; M. D. 1922; surgeon, Royal Navy, 1910 Served with Mediterranean Fleet, 1914; with Grand Fleet, 1915; in South Irish Waters (Queenstown) 1915; Egypt, 1916- 17; at R. N. Barracks, Chatham, 1918. Surgeon Lieutenant- Commander 1918 (ante-dated to 1916).

DANSON, John Rhys 1897- 1903

S. of Rev. James [Myers] D., 19 Bon-Accord Crescent. B. 24 July 1887. Entd. Middle I. Served apprenticeship as mechanical engineer with Messrs. Clyne, Mitchell & Company, Aberdeen; assistant engineer, Dundee Corporation Electricity Supply Department 1908; second engineer in the power station, La Plata, Buenos Aires, 1914; assistant municipal electrical engineer, Georgetown, Penang, S. S., 1919. Private, 14th Batt. London regiment (London Scottish) (T. F.), 17 Dec. 1914. Served in France, June to Nov. 1916; in Salonika to June 1917; in Palestine to June 1918; in Belgium, to Feb. 1919. Sergt., 20 Dec. 1914; Company Sergt. Major, 4 June 1915; Regmtl Sergt. Major 22 Nov. 1916. Mentioned, 29 March and 25 Oct. 1917. D. C. M., 21 Aug. 1918. Demobd. 5 March 1919.

DAVIDSON, Alexander 1869- 1870

[S. of Alexander D.], Tarves. Age 17. Entd. II. Farmer, Cairnhill and Little Meldrum, Tarves.

DAVIDSON, Alexander 1881- 1886

S. of Alexander D., Mains of Cairnbrogie, Tarves. Age 12. Entd. Middle II. Entered service of Northern Assurance Company, Aberdeen, as junior clerk, 1889; now cashier.

DAVIDSON, Alexander 1884- 1887

S. of Rev. George D., Logie Coldstone, Dinnet. Age 14. Entd. Classical II. Served apprenticeship with Messrs. Walker and Beattie, land surveyors, Aberdeen; in 1892, went to South Africa, subsequently becoming manager of the New Kleinfontein Gold Mining Company, Benoni; served as a volunteer throughout the South African War, receiving the Queen's Medal with four clasps; died at Kleinfontein Farm, Benoni, 9 January 1915.

DAVIDSON, Alexander Aitken 1900-[1907]

S. of Thomas D., 13 Affleck Street. b. 3 April 1891. Entd. Lower II. Of Messrs. Davidsons (Aberdeen), Limited, whole-sale fish merchants, Aberdeen. Private, 45th Battalion, Gordon Highlanders (T. F.), Oct 1914. Promoted Sergeant. 2nd Lieut., 4th Batt. Gordon Highlanders, Nov. 1914. Served at home. Demobd. on medical grounds, 1917 (Lieut.)

DAVIDSON, Alexander Campbell 1904- 1906

S. of Alexander D., Bromhill Park. b 26 April 1896. Entd. Lower III
